Here some excerpts from Wisconsin beer and liquor laws and the relevant statute references that pertain to bartenders:

No premises operated under a Class “A” or “Class “B” license may be open for business unless there is upon the premises the licensee, the agent named in the license, or some person who has an operator’s license and who is responsible for the acts of all persons selling or serving any intoxicating beverages to customers. 125.32 (2), 125.68 (2)

How to obtain an OPERATORS’ LICENSE:

The applicant must:

1. Be 18 years of age. 125.04 (5) (d)
2. Have completed a written application and paid the necessary fee. 125.17 (1), 125.17 (3)
3. Have successfully completed a responsible beverage server training course within the past 2 years and provide proof of same. 125.17 (6) or have held an operator’s license within the past 2 years.
4. Be approved by the Town Board. 125.17 (1)

The operators’ license is valid for a period of one or 2 years and expires on June 30. It is valid only within the municipality where it was issued. 125.17 (2), (3)

How to obtain A PROVISIONAL OPERATORS’ LICENSE:

The applicant must:

1. Be 18 years of age. 125.32 (2), 125.68 (2)
2. Have completed a written application and paid the necessary fee. 125.17 (1)
3. Be enrolled in a training course and provide proof of same. 125.17 (6) (b)

A provisional license is valid for 60 days after its issuance, or until a regular operators’ license is issued. It is issued by the Town clerk and is valid only within the the municipality where it was issued 125.17 (5)

A training course is not required for issuance of an operators’ license provided:

1. The person is renewing an operators’ license
2. Within the past 2 years, the person held a Class “A” or “Class “B” license or an operator’s license.
3. Within the past 2 years, the person has completed a responsible beverage server training course. 125.17 (6)
